# Southampton Golf & Country Club first in area to offer golf boards

outhampton Golf and Country Club is the first Grey-Bruce club to get on board with golf boards.

They have four of them available this season for golfers who would like to try this innovative approach to getting around the golf course.

"They're a lot of fun," said General Manager Sandy Simpson, who has tried them out several times since they arrived at the course.

Golf clubs go on the front then riders stand on a platform and use a throttle with an automatic braking system which stops the board as soon as the rider lets go of the throttle.

For turning, it's a matter of leaning into the turn like you would when surfing or snow-boarding.

The fully electric boards have a maximum speed of 10 mph although the ones at the Southampton club will operate on the medium setting which will limit speed to 6 mph.

The cost will be \$25 plus tax per 18-hole round (no 9-hole rate) and you must be at least 19 years old to rent them.

Users must also watch a short instructional video and sign a waiver before hopping on board.

Golf boards are available at more than 250 golf courses worldwide, according to the company's website (golfboard.com).

But the Southampton club is one of only 8 golf courses in Ontario with the boards.

They discovered them while surfing the internet and when club owner Kevin O'Brien saw them he said "we have to get one of those."

The club has a lease-to-own four-year arrangement for the four boards and will order more if needed.

While the boards have a natural appeal for the younger

generation - and snowboarders and surfers - Simpson said they may have a broader appeal than you might think.

"It will be interesting to see but there is definitely interest from older golfers too," she said.

## Wounded Warriors tourney returns


#### Fundraiser for organization helping soldiers, veterans and first responders

## New manager at Walkerton club

Keith Ellis is an avid golfer who has already had a significant impact on the 9-hole club

eith Ellis probably won't get his usual 200 rounds of golf in this year. But that doesn't mean his enthusiasm for the game has diminished in his new role as general manager of the Walkerton Golf and Curling Club.

Quite the opposite.

"I bring my passion and excitement (for golf) to this job and I hope it rubs off on others," he said during a recent interview with Grey-Bruce Golf.

The Walkerton resident, who has been playing golf since his mid-teens, has already had a significant impact on the 9-hole club.

Membership is up by 48 players this year and last year, when he was a part-time employee, he was able to grow the men's league from about 30 regulars to an average of 60 per night.

This year he has already attracted 84 players for one men's night and has set a goal of hitting 100.

The 40-year-old former supervisor in the gaming industry has helped grow the men's and ladies leagues by recruiting hole sponsors and offering better prizes.

He has also added a second shotgun start for men's night at 3 p.m. (the other shotgun start is at 5:45 p.m.).

Also new this year is a Match Play competition which already has 64 players committed to playing in it.

Other changes include a renovation of the pro shop and upgrade of the club's website which should be completed soon.

The club is also working on getting a junior program, including camps, established this summer.

Before joining the golf industry, Ellis worked at casinos in Windsor and Niagara and then returned to his home turf with a position at Hanover Raceway and Slots where he spent 10 years.

He also got a taste of the golf industry when he helped his parents, Keith and Fran, after they purchased Pinewoods Golf near Sauble Beach in 2000 (they sold the course three years later).

Ellis got his chance to work full-time in the industry when Ryan Martin, then general

manager at the Walkerton club, resigned at the end of last year.

He began his new position on Feb. 6.

## Walk your way to a better round

It's not only great exercise but it also gives you more time to focus on your shots

used to say, (amongst many odd things I've said), that I'm just "not good enough" to walk a golf course.

My meaning was that as I see the greats walk those courses every weekend, I'm just an amateur...working away on my game...needing all the energy I can muster to try to play OK, let alone walking, carrying my 'heavy' bag everywhere, pulling a cart at least.

A study done by Reebok years ago suggested that golfers who walk burn approximately an average of 1,500 calories in a four-hour round versus 675 calories riding the same course

Carrying your bag vs pull cart is minimal in caloric difference, so walk and pull your way for better exercise! Most pull carts are free to use anyway!

Plus, I believe that walking connects you to your game better...your movement point from shot to shot is a more direct line, and the thinking that tends to happen when walking to your next ball compared to riding is more productive.

You tend to think about what you'll do with this next shot vs crying to your 'cartner' as to what just went wrong.

And in a cart you probably won't have enough time to cycle through the negative and get to the positive.

Where I'm from, especially on the course...any positivity is a good thing!

Wanna get better, and a little fitter? Walk it! Make up your



investment in the day with more cool drinks and snacks. The staff will be OK with that.

## Hearn talks about his local ties

'Part of the reason why I am where I am today is because of where I started'

Editor's Note: David Hearn, who held the lead briefly at The Players Championship in May before a rough weekend sent him plummeting to a tie for 69th, talked about his local connections during a trip last fall to Pike Lake. fter wrapping up last season at the BMW Championship, PGA Tour player David Hearn headed back to where he learned to play the game - Pike Lake Golf Centre near Mount Forest.

The low-key visit last fall was part of the 37-year-old's ongoing support of an annual charity tournament named in honour of the late wife of one of his early mentors, Pike Lake golf pro George Forrest.

The Mary Lynne Forrest Memorial tournament has raised about \$700,000 for local hospitals during the past 12 years and Hearn has supported it over the years with donated items.

Last year, he decided to go one step further by offering as a prize the opportunity for three local golfers to play with him for 18 holes.

"Part of the reason why I am where I am today is because of where I started and to be able to help in this way - to give back - means a lot to me," he said during an interview with Grey-Bruce Golf.

His connection to Pike Lake goes back many years to when his family,

which is from Brantford, Ont., would spend their summers at a seasonal residence east of Mount Forest (it's now his parents' permanent home).

"I would hit balls at our property and when I got to be seven years old we started to look for a place to play golf and Pike Lake became my home," he said.

The course was welcoming to "really young golfers" and Hearn received a lot of help from George Forrest.

"George was the first golf professional I hung around with a lot and he helped steer me in the right direction. He has had a really big influence on me getting into the game and helping me get off to the right start."

Back then Forrest's role was just to share his knowledge of the game and he left the swing instructions to David's father, Geoff.

Pike Lake didn't have driving range memberships at that point, but created one to accommodate Hearn, who would spend countless hours at the range. Forrest can't remember any golfer putting in more time at the range than Hearn.

His dedication to the game has paid off in a career where he earns a very comfortable living doing what he loves. Last season, he finished 87th on the PGA Tour money list and earned \$1.2 million.




